

## Snow Buds™ Table Runner

12" X 36"

### Materials Needed:

- Two Snow Buds Art Prints
- Fabric 1: one FQ for HST and sashing
- Fabric 2: one FQ for HST and sashing
- Fabric 3: 7/8 yd. for border, binding, and backing
- Cotton Batting: 3/8 yd.

### Before Getting Started:

- HST = Half Square Triangle
- WOF = Width of Fabric
- RST = Right Sides Together
- Use an accurate ¼" seam allowance unless otherwise noted.

### Cutting:

1. Trim both Snow Buds Art Prints to 8 ½" x 8 ½" square (trim equally on all sides to maintain position of image)
2. Fabric 1: Cut two 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips
3. Fabric 2: Cut two 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips
4. Fabric 1 and 2: Make twenty-four 2 ½" HST using your preferred method
5. Fabric 3:
  1. Cut one 13" x WOF strip for backing
  2. Cut three 2 ¼" x WOF strips for binding
  3. Cut three 2 ½" x WOF strips. From this, subcut:
    - i. Two 2 ½" x 32 ½" strips
    - ii. Two 2 ½" x 12 ½" strips

### Assembly:

1. With RST attach the Fabric 1 sashing strips to the top of each Snow Buds Art Print. Then, with RST, attach the Fabric 2 sashing strips to the bottom of each Snow Buds Art Print. Iron sashing strips away from Art Print and set aside.
2. Using the Diagram 1 as a placement guide, follow the assembly steps using sixteen HST's to make the center snowflake. You will end up with an 8 ½" x 8 ½" square.
3. With the remaining HST's, make two rows of four, alternating the light and dark fabric of the HST's, using Diagram 1 as a placement guide. With RST, sew one row to the bottom sashing piece of each Snow Buds Art Print. Iron open.
4. With RST sew top sashing of each Snow Buds Art Print to center snowflake square. Iron flat. You should now have an 8 ½" x 32 ½" rectangle.
5. Sew the 2 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric 3 border strips to each side of the Table Runner. Sew the 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric 3 border strips to each end. Now would be the time to add any embellishing to the table runner.\*

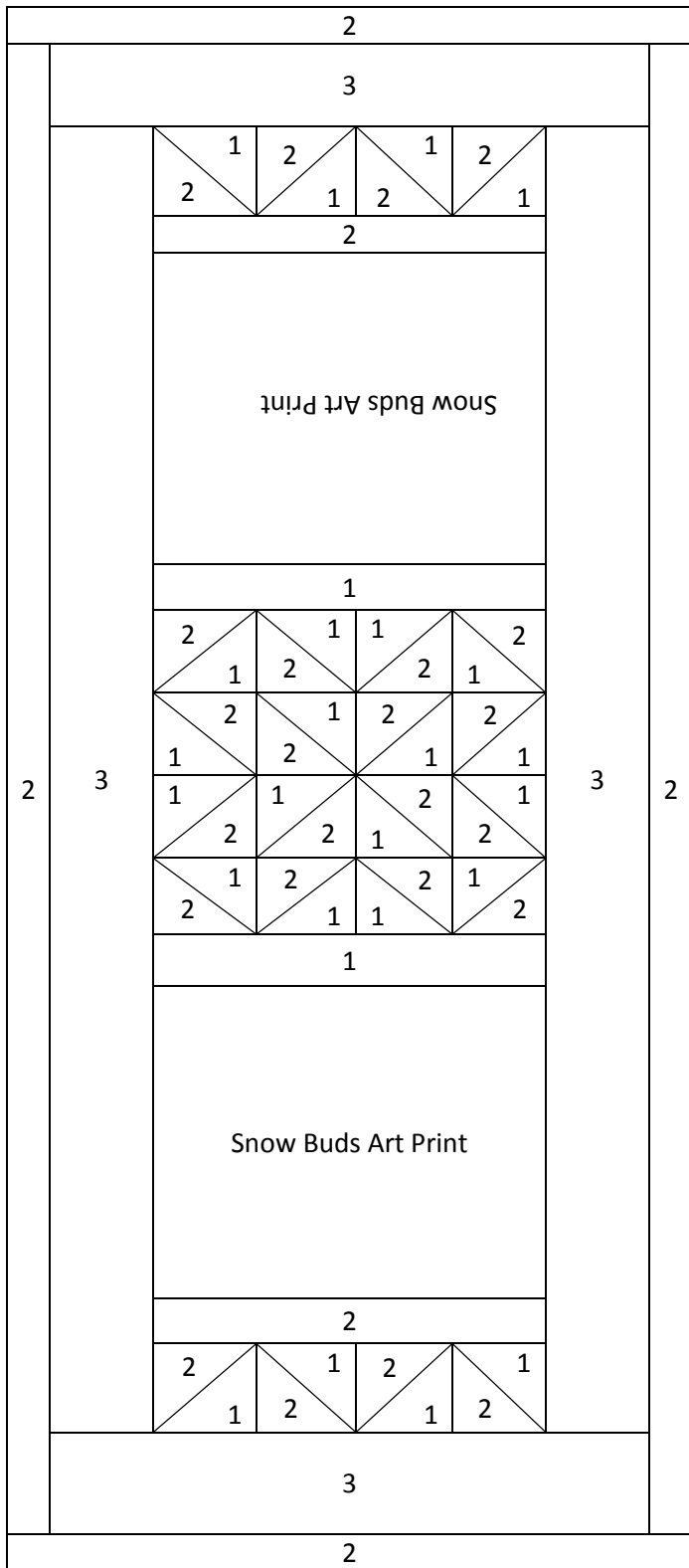
### Finishing Up:

1. Use the 2 ¼" Fabric 3 strips to make the binding using your preferred method.
2. Layer backing, batting, and table runner top together and finish with a stitch-in-the-ditch between the border and center rectangle. Now would be the time to add any quilting.\*
3. Trim the backing and batting even with top of runner and bind.

***Place it in the center of your table for a fun touch of color!***

\* **Embellishing and Quilting:** (Optional) If you plan on all-over quilting your table runner, do not embellish until after you are done quilting. You can embellish your project using beads or sequin snowflakes and highlight portions using embroidery thread. 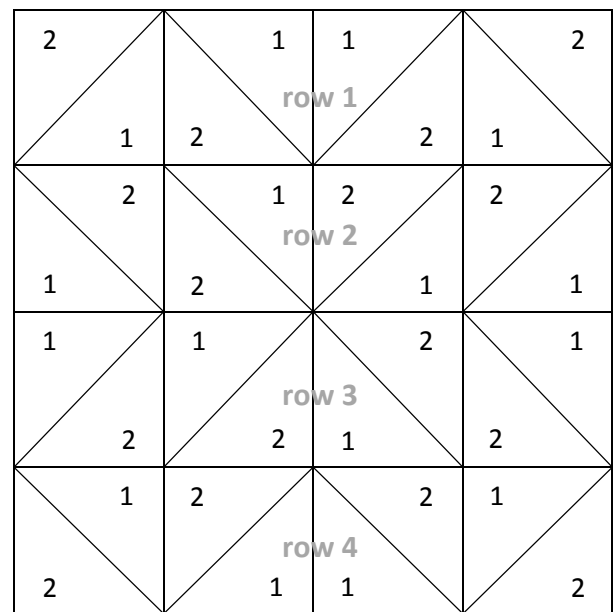

**Diagram 1 Order of Assembly**

- Assemble rows 1-4 one at a time.
- Press seams for rows 1 & 3 to the right and 2 & 4 to the left.
- Matching up seams, sew rows 1 & 2 together, sew rows 1 & 2 to row 3, sew rows 1, 2 & 3 to row 4.
