

Beach Walk



Whale Watch Pillow

14" x 20"

Materials Needed:

- Beach Walk Truly McKenna Art Print Panel: Whale Watch (BW09-P)
- Fabric 1: AYC-16314-333 Sea Glass ¾ yard for border strips and backing
- Fabric 2: AYC-16318-43 Leaf Fat Eighth for center square within square cornerstones and binding
- ½ yard cotton batting or fusible fleece
- ½ yard muslin for lining front and back sections of pillow
- 14" x 20" pillow insert

Before Getting Started:

- Use ¼" seam allowance
- WOF Width of Fabric
- RST Right Sides Together

Preparing Panel and Fabric:

- Trim Art Print Panel to 10½" x 16½"
- Fabric 1:
 - Cut two 2½" x 10½" strips
 - Cut two 2½" x 16½" strips
 - Cut two 15" x 14" rectangles (these will be used to make the pocket backing)
- Fabric 2:
 - Cut one 1½" x WOF strip for binding pillow pocket edges.
- Fabric 1 and 2:
 - With remaining Fabric 1 and Fabric 2 make: four 2½" square-within-a-squares for pillow front cornerstones, using your preferred method

Pillow Front:

- 1. Sew the top and bottom fabric strips to panel. Iron away from panel.
- 2. Sew cornerstones to the side strips. Iron seam towards the fabric strip. Sew side strips on. Iron seams toward the panel.
- 3. Make a quilt sandwich with muslin (backing), batting and pillow top. Trim batting and muslin to the same size as the pillow top front. Quilt pillow top as desired. Add decorative stitches, beading or heat set crystals at this time.

Pillow Back:

1. Make two quilt sandwiches with muslin, batting and the 15" x 14" fabric rectangles. Quilt with a simple cross hatch design.

Hint: Draw diagonal lines using a Frixion pen and a ruler to create a diamond pattern and simply sew on all the lines. Iron and the Frixion pen lines will disappear!

- 2. Trim quilted pieces to 14½" x 13½".
- 3. Bind one 14½" edge of each quilted sandwich.
- 4. Now would be the time to add a small applique shape to one of the guilted back pieces.

Assembly:

1. Layer pillow top RST with quilted back pieces. Overlap the bound edges in the center. Keep in mind, the back piece that is closest to the pillow front will be the one that shows the most when you turn the pillow right side out.

2.	Pin all around the edges and sew all four sides. Do a nice zig-zag stitch close to the edge to help prevent fraying.
3.	Turn inside out, insert pillow form and enjoy your creation!
*If y	you have a hard time finding the correct size pillow form - <u>Fairfield Firm Pillow Form</u> has a zipper on one end. You can take out some of the stuffing in a 20" x 20" pillow to make a "custom fit insert".
