Snow Buds[™] Peppermint Bench Pillow

Materials Needed:

- 2 Snow Buds Art Prints
- Fabric 1: One Fat Eighth for trees
- Fabric 2: One FQ for background for trees, tree trunks and pinwheels
- Fabric 3: 1/3 yard for pinwheels
- Fabric 4: 3/3 yard for borders and backing
- Small scrap of brown for tree trunks (1" x 9" piece needed)
- Cotton Batting: 13" x 27" piece
- 14" zipper
- 12" x 28" pillow insert

Before Getting Started:

- HST = Half Square Triangle
- RST = Right Sides Together
- WOF = Width of Fabric
- WST = Wrong Sides Together
- Use ¼" seam allowance unless otherwise noted.

Cutting:

- 1. Trim both Snow Buds Art Prints to 8½" x 8 ½" squares (trim equally on all sides to maintain position of image).
- 2. Fabric 2:
 - a. Cut two 1¼" x 9" strips
 - b. Cut three 21/2" x 3" rectangles
- 3. Fabric 1 and Fabric 2: Make fifteen 1½" x 2½" flying geese using your preferred method.
- 4. Fabric 3
 - a. Cut two 1" x WOF strips for pillow flange. From each strip subcut:
 - i. One 1" x 26½" strip
 - ii. One 1" x 12½" strip
 - b. Iron strips in half lengthwise, WST
- 5. Fabric 2 and Fabric 3: Make sixteen 1½" HST's using your preferred method
- 6. Fabric 4:
 - a. Cut two 2½" x WOF strips. From *each* strip subcut:
 - i. One 2½" x 22½" border strip
 - ii. One $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " border strip
 - b. Set aside remaining fabric for backing

Assembly:

Trees

- 1. Using the fifteen $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " flying geese units, refer to Diagram 1 for assembly of each tree unit.
 - a. Tree 1: Sew four units together
 - b. Tree 2: Sew five units together
 - c. Tree 3: Sew six units together
- 2. Sew one 2½" x 3" Fabric 2 rectangle to the top of each tree unit (these will be trimmed in *Tree Trunks step 3*).



Tree Trunks

- Using the two 1¼" x 9" Fabric 2 strips and the 1" x 9" brown fabric strip, make a strip set with the brown fabric in the middle. Should measure 2½" wide by 9" long when sewn together. Subcut one - 2" section, one - 2½" section, and one - 3" section.
- 2. Sew one tree trunk section to the bottom of each tree unit. Tree one: 3" trunk; Tree 2: 2½" trunk; Tree 3: 2" trunk.
- 3. Measure and trim each tree unit to 2½" x 8½", trimming at the Fabric 2 rectangle on the top of each tree unit.

Pinwheels

Make 4 pinwheel squares using the sixteen 1¹/₂" HST's. Using four HST's, make a pinwheel square that will measure 2¹/₂" square. Refer to Diagram 2.

Pillow Top Layout: Refer to layout Diagram for all pillow top units.

- 1. With RST, sew one pinwheel square to each end of the two 2½" x 8½" Fabric 4 border strips. Iron seams toward border strips.
- 2. With RST, sew tree units to the Snow Buds Art Prints in order shown. Iron all seams toward art prints.
- 3. With RST, sew the two 2½" x 22½" Fabric 4 border strips to top and bottom of tree/art panel unit. Iron seams towards border.
- 4. With RST, sew pinwheel border units to each end of the pillow top unit, completing the border. Iron seams toward border.
- 5. Layer the pillow top unit on top of the 13" x 27" piece of cotton batting and stitch-in-the-ditch around the center and the border.
- 6. Sew Fabric 3 flange pieces to pillow top edges, with raw edges facing out and using a ¹/₈" seam allowance to attach all four pieces, over lapping pieces in corners. This gives the look of piping and rounded corners when finished.

***Embellishments:** (Optional) At this stage you can add some beading or decorative stem stitching to your pillow top. Find custom embellishment kits at <u>www.pineneedles.com</u>. Show your creativity!

Backing


- 1. From the remaining Fabric 4, cut two 13" x 28" rectangles. Fold in half RST to make two 13" x 14" rectangles.
- 2. Take zipper and "snug it up" to folded edge <u>inside</u> one of the rectangles (zipper teeth facing up). Sew ¼" from fold, making sure to catch the zipper tape.
- 3. Open the fabric and iron down both sides away from the zipper and top stitch. Repeat with second backing piece. When complete it should measure 13" x 29".


Finishing Up:


- 1. With RST, center the pillow top on the backing. Note: the backing will be slightly larger.
- 2. Pin all around edges, making sure to unzip the zipper about 4 inches so you can turn the pillow right side out.
- 3. Sew ¼" seam around edges back tacking zipper section to reinforce.
- 4. Remove pins, trim your pillow backing and finish with an overlock or zigzag on the raw edges for a finished look.
- 5. Turn pillow top right side out and slightly push out the corners.
- 6. Insert Pillow form.

This pillow looks great on a bench, couch, or wherever a touch of whimsy suits you!
